808. FOOD SERVICES	
1. Purpose	Food service programs of the district shall be directed at meeting the needs of the pupils.
2. Authority SC 504, 1337	The Board shall provide food service for lunch in all the schools of this district. Unless they have been excused by the principal, all students are expected to remain in school for the lunch. Food is not to be eaten in the hallway or in the lounge areas.
SC 504	Food sold by the school may be purchased by students, teachers, and other district employees.
3. Delegation of Responsibility	The operation and supervision of the food services program shall be the responsibility of the Superintendent or his/her designee.
4. Guidelines SC 504, 1337	A periodic review of the cafeteria accounts shall be made by the Superintendent and/or auditor.
SC 504	Surplus accounts shall be used only for the improvement and maintenance of the food service program. All funds derived from the operation, maintenance or sponsorship of the food service facilities shall be deposited in the Food Service Account, a special bank account, in the same manner as other funds belonging to the district. Such funds shall be expended in such manner as may be approved and directed by the Board, but no amount shall be transferred from Services Account to any other account or fund except that district advances to the food services program may be returned to the district's general fund from any surplus resulting from its operation.
SC 1335	Provisions shall be made for free and reduced rate meals as prescribed by federal and state law, in accordance with established guidelines.

<p>School Code 504, 1335, 1337</p>	<p>Determination of students eligible to receive a free or reduced price lunch shall be the responsibility of the Superintendent who may designate others to carry out that responsibility.</p> <p>In determining such eligibility, the following criteria shall be used:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Pennsylvania Income Guidelines which take into account family income in relation to family size.2. Circumstances such as unusually high medical bills, extended unemployment, disaster or casualty losses which cause family income to fall within the eligibility criteria.3. In certain cases, students residing in foster homes may be eligible.
